Until December 2010 he was the Chairman of Lloyd's Register, where he held the office of Chairman and Chief executive from 1999 to 2007. He is credited with the rescue of the group, having moved it from a turnover of some £247 million with attendant losses of £57 million to a turnover in excess of £820 million and a profit of £127 million.

David has spent more than twenty-five years in the Oil and Gas business and the last sixteen years in shipping.

He was awarded the CBE in the 2009 New Year's Honour's List for Services to the Maritime Industry. In 2013 he was awarded the Russian Federation medal of honour for an outstanding contribution to the Russian Maritime Industry.

An experienced Chairman and CEO David has attained his first appointment to the Board of John Brown Plc at the age of 37. In the prior three years he was one of three founding directors of John Brown Offshore Structures. His thirty-one years of international corporate leadership have given him a wealth of trading and cultural knowledge, which he continues to develop and utilise in his current roles.
